# Past and Present: Norling Family Continues Long Giving History with Bethesda

he Norling Family, local philanthropists with strong business and personal ties to the Kandiyohi County area, has had a long historical relationship with Bethesda over the past 50 years.

"My father, Albin Norling, and his brother Fred, were big supporters of Bethesda as far back as 50 years ago," shared Rayburn Norling. "Both brothers also stayed at Bethesda Heritage Center between the early 1970s to the mid 1980s, and Carolyn Norling's mother, Dorothy Johnson, lived at Bethesda

Pleasant View starting in the early 1970s."

This relationship continues today through philanthropic support from the Norling Family toward Bethesda's Town Center project, which will include the new Norling Family Café. "Throughout history, all of our family stays at Bethesda have been positive experiences," stated Palmer Norling. The children were soon joined by older citizens at what was called the "country home." By 1939, Bethesda began serving exclusively elderly persons, and in 1953, Bethesda Heritage Center opened its doors in the city of Willmar. The "country home" was closed in 1979 when the Pleasant View campus was constructed.

Much has changed since our modest beginnings, but the tradition of caring has not. Our legacy is very much alive; our vision for the future is built upon it. We are excited to embark on the next step in this journey as our Heritage Center and Pleasant View campuses become one.

Bethesda is proud to announce that the name for our new long-term care building, uniting Heritage Center and Pleasant View, will be **Bethesda Grand**: *Senior Living Community*.



It is our hope that people who have a short-term therapy stay at the Club Suites will get well, go home and then stay well by having the option to transition to outpatient therapy or by joining Club Bethesda to continue improving on their health."
